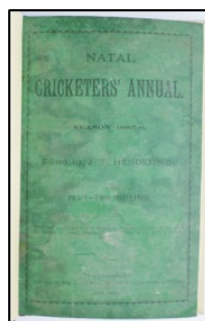


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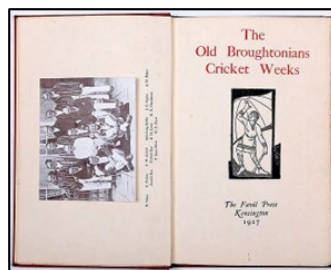
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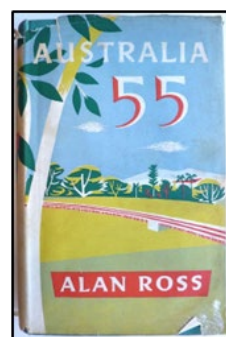
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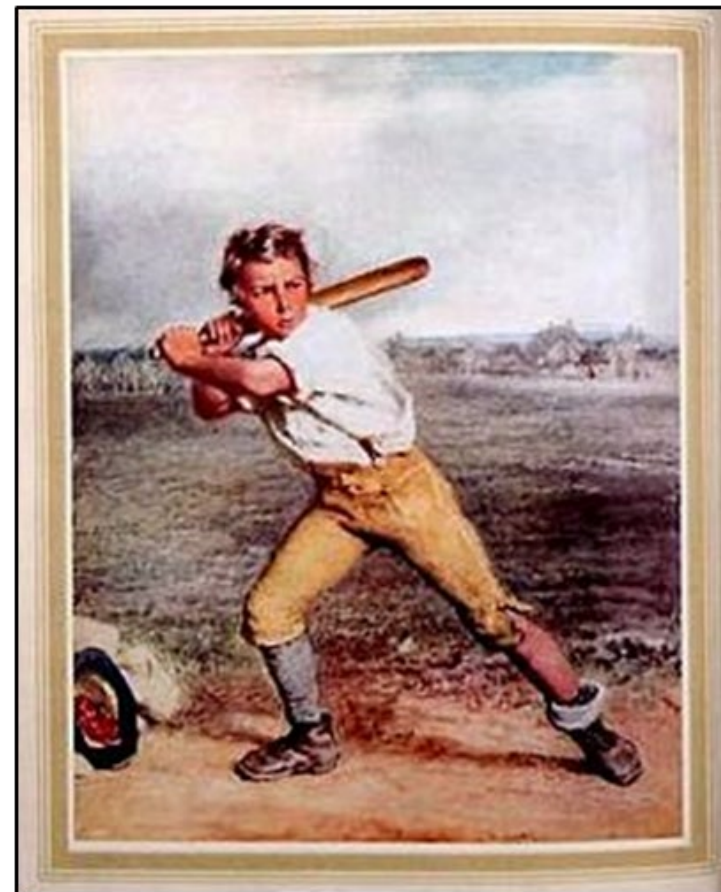


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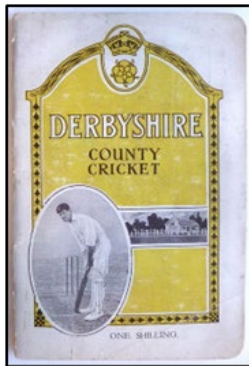


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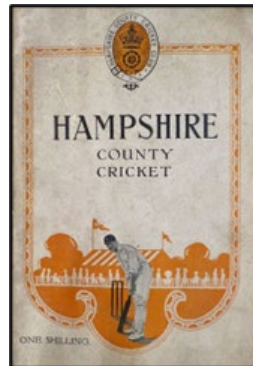
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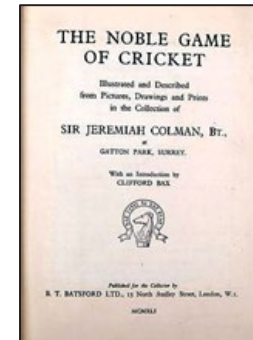
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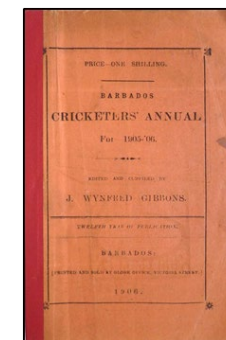
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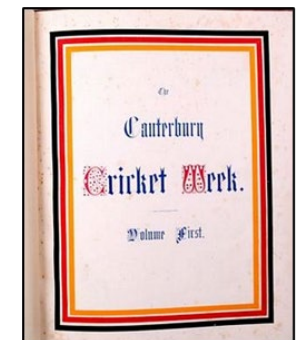
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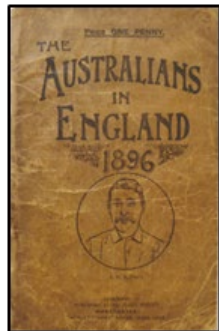
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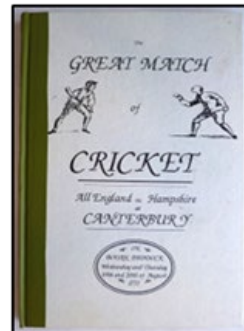
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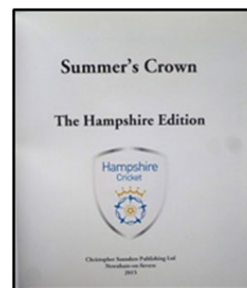
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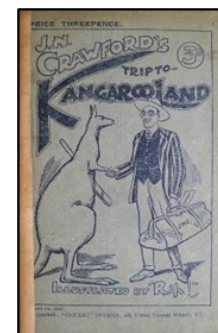
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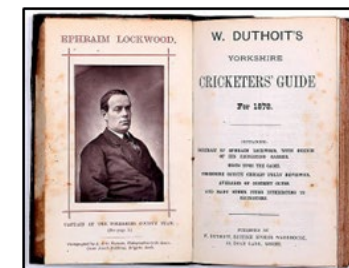
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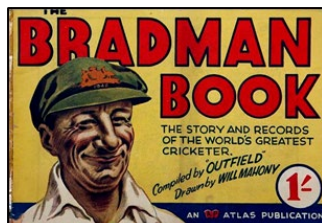
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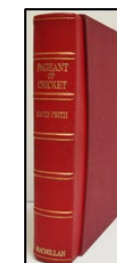
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The Magic of Bookshops

John Arlott, cricket's immortal chronicler, captured the magic of a second-hand bookshop in a poem. Here is an excerpt:

*Like a cloak hangs the bookshop smell,
Soothing, unique and reminding:
The book-collector knows its spell,
Subtle hints of books and binding
In the fine, back bookshop dust
Paper, printer's-ink and leather,
Binder's glue and paper rust
And time, all mixed together.*

These poignant lines, penned many years ago by Arlott, were reprinted in a monograph entitled *Farewell to True Bookshops* by journalist and cricket-lover John Harriott. In it he bemoans the demise of the second-hand bookshop, lamenting: 'Somewhere in London there should be a Wailing Wall for those who love books and bookshops but now feel abandoned.'

The cricket devotee need not feel abandoned though. Pay J W McKenzie's bookshop a visit and you will find a vast selection of old and new cricket books as well as countless items of cricket memorabilia.

Following in the footsteps of Hudsons, Epworth and E K Bown, I'm happy to say my bookshop at 12 Stoneleigh Park Road, Ewell in Surrey has been welcoming visitors from around the world for more than 50 years.

Some of my most pleasant memories are of visits to see John Arlott both at his home in Alresford in Hampshire, and then on Alderney in the Channel Islands.

It is a shame he never came to my cricket bookshop, but I sense that it would have met with his approval.

The Cricketer

The Cricketer was first published in 1921, edited by the Middlesex and England cricketer Pelham Warner. Other editors include E.W. Swanton, David Frith, Christopher Martin-Jenkins, Simon Hughes and Huw Turbervill.

Published without a break since 1921 it is the longest-running cricket magazine. It is only the third periodical to deal exclusively with cricket, following The American Cricketer which ran from 1877 until 1929, Cricket: A Weekly Record of the Game which ran from 1882 until 1913. (In its final year of publication (1914) it was published under the title: The World of Cricket.

With the exception of the years 1915 to 1920, Cricket and The Cricketer have provided regular contemporary news and scores of important cricket matches from 1882 to date.

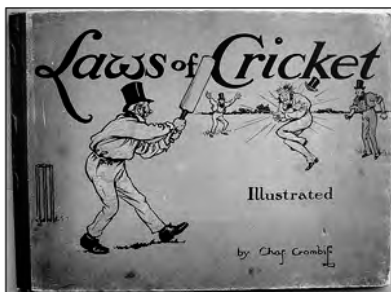

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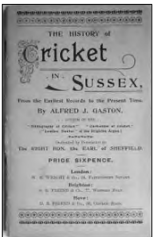
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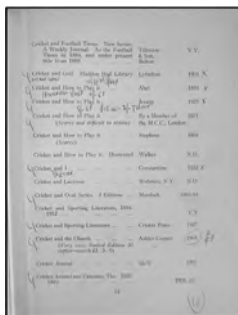
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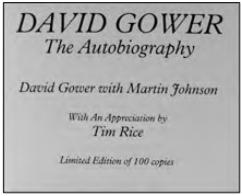


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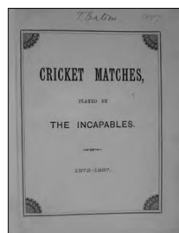
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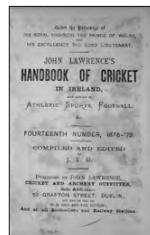
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Both the engraving and the laws are incorrect. The engraving does not show the third stump, and the laws do not mention either lbw or the third stump.
