# The Magic of Bookshops

John Arlott, cricket's immortal chronicler, captured the magic of a second-hand bookshop in a poem. Here is an excerpt:

Like a cloak hangs the bookshop smell, Soothing, unique and reminding:
The book-collector knows its spell,
Subtle hints of books and binding
In the fine, back bookshop dust
Paper, printer's-ink and leather,
Binder's glue and paper rust
And time, all mixed together.

These poignant lines, penned many years ago by Arlott, were reprinted in a monograph entitled *Farewell to True Bookshops* by journalist and cricket-lover John Harriott. In it he bemoans the demise of the second-hand bookshop, lamenting: 'Somewhere in London there should be a Wailing Wall for those who love books and bookshops but now feel abandoned.'

The cricket devotee need not feel abandoned though. Pay J W McKenzie's bookshop a visit and you will find a vast selection of old and new cricket books as well as countless items of cricket memorabilia.

Following in the footsteps of Hudsons, Epworth and E K Bown, I'm happy to say my bookshop at 12 Stoneleigh Park Road, Ewell in Surrey has been welcoming visitors from around the world for more than 50 years.

Some of my most pleasant memories are of visits to see John Arlott both at his home in Alresford in Hampshire, and then on Alderney in the Channel Islands.

It is a shame he never came to my cricket bookshop, but I sense that it would have met with his approval.

## The Cricketer

The Cricketer was first published in 1921, edited by the Middlesex and England cricketer Pelham Warner. Other editors include E.W. Swanton, David Frith, Christopher Martin-Jenkins, Simon Hughes and Huw Turbervill.

Published without a break since 1921 it is the longest-running cricket magazine. It is only the third periodical to deal exclusively with cricket, following The American Cricketer which ran from 1877 until 1929, Cricket: A Weekly Record of the Game which ran from 1882 until 1913. (In its final year of publication (1914) it was published under the title: The World of Cricket.

With the exception of the years 1915 to 1920, Cricket and The Cricketer have provided regular contemporary news and scores of important cricket matches from 1882 to date.







compiled from Arthur Haygarth's notes in the MCC Library at Lord's. These volumes give full scores of all important matches played between 1744 and 1883. This work and *Wisden's Cricketers' Almanack* are the standard reference books of cricket. No other work on any sport can have involved so much research.

Haygarth devoted his life to investigating cricket and its history, collecting material, studying score-books, and correcting records. He questioned every notable cricketer and knowledgeable person. He absorbed the early records of Epps, Britcher and Bentley into Scores and Biographies by incorporating full scores of all major matches, interspersed with short biographies of many cricketers who played in the matches.

The first volume of Scores and Biographies was published in 1862 by Frederick Lillywhite, who annoyed Haygarth by claiming a part in the compilation. After four volumes had appeared F.P. Miller, the Surrey captain assisted financially before M.C.C. carried on the work and produced volumes V to XV between 1879 and 1925, when they decided that it was no longer financially viable. Although volumes I to IV bear the name F. Lillywhite, Arthur Haygarth in fact compiled volumes I to XIV. Volume XV only contains biographies and was edited by F.S. Ashley-Cooper from Haygarth's notes. Volumes XVI to XXII were also compiled later from Haygarth's notes.

Whether Lambert had personally anything to do with the fraud it is hard to say, but he was far too ignorant to have written or even dictated anything of the kind himself. He was a man of very bad character, and probably gave the use of his name for money...to some unscrupulous speculator.'

Rait Kerr, Cricket. Catalogue of an Exhibition, 1950, no. 104: 'The frontispiece, with a key to the positions in the field similar to that in Boxall, represents a game at Lewes. These 'Guides' ran to numerous editions. A spurious twentieth edition would, from the content of the Laws, appear to be earlier than the twelfth which is probably the last. It has lately been proven that except for this twelfth edition, which contains an accurate version of the Code of 1830, Lambert cannot be relied on as an authority for changes in the Laws.'

Allen, Early Books on Cricket, 1987, no. 17: 'The puzzle surrounding the numbering of the editions is unlikely ever to be solved. There are 13 known editions, the penultimate being numbered 20th and the last, which was published circa 1830-32, being numbered 12th. The 13th-19th editions have not been found and were probably never produced.'

Gaston, Bibliography of Cricket, 1895, page 8, incorrectly notes: 'Lambert's Guide ran through 20 Editions, but dates are not given on title pages.'

Taylor, Catalogue of Cricket Literature, 1906, page 61: 'The first and second issues comprise 55pp. post 8vo.; the third, fourth and fifth editions 62pp. post 8vo.; the seventh edition 61pp. 16mo.; to which was subjoined The New Single Wicket Game; and the tenth to twentieth editions 47pp. 16mo. These guides are very rare...Unfortunately the editions are undated.'

Taylor probably copied the error in Gaston, *Bibliography of Cricket*, 1895, and incorrectly notes: 'Lambert's Guide ran through twenty editions.'

Goldman, Bibliography of Cricket, 1937, page 119: 'Although copied from Boxall's Guide, is one of the rarest cricket publications...the later editions seem to be scarcer than the earlier ones.'
